VOLUNTEER VISITS



PRIVATE WYLIE R. HERROD

Wylie Herrod, born in Milton, TN, enlisted in the Army on Feb 27, 1943, undergoing basic and Anti-Aircraft Artillery training at Ft Bliss, TX. He served with the 483rd AAA, participating in critical WWII operations in the Pacific, including the invasions of Peleliu and Iwo Jima. After setting up anti-aircraft positions, he witnessed significant military events, including the dropping of atomic bombs and V-J Day. He was honorably discharged on December 31, 1945, awarded multiple medals for his service, and later returned to Middle Tennessee, where he married and retired from the U.S. Postal Service.
